ORDER

On July 17, 2023, this Court held an initial pretrial and scheduling conference. During the conference, Counsel for Defendant moved for an ends-of-justice continuance. Counsel explained if the trial was placed on Judge Jonker's next docket, August 21, 2023, she would not have time to review the voluminous discovery and prepare for trial. Defendant Weeden agreed with the motion and the Government did not object.

This Court finds, for reasons stated on the record, and based on the factors set forth in 18 U.S.C. § 3161(h)(7)(B)(iv), that the ends of justice served by the adjournment outweigh the best interests of the public and Defendant in a speedy trial. Accordingly, the Court GRANTS Defendant's motion for a continuance. The Court hereby orders that the speedy trial clock be tolled from April 7, 2023 to October 2, 2023, and that period of time shall be excluded from the computation of time within which trial in this matter shall be commenced. This case will be placed on the October 2, 2023 trial docket.
