**ORDER**

On August 16, 2023, this Court held a status conference by video. During the conference, Counsel for Defendant moved for an ends-of-justice continuance of 60 days. Counsel explained that he would need time to resolve issues with receiving discovery and then reviewing it. Defendant Weeden agreed with the motion and the Government did not object.

This Court finds, for reasons stated on the record, and based on the factors set forth in 18 U.S.C. § 3161(h)(7)(B)(iv), that the ends of justice served by the adjournment outweigh the best interests of the public and Defendant in a speedy trial. Accordingly, the Court GRANTS Defendant's motion for a continuance. The Court hereby orders that the speedy trial clock be tolled for two months from August 16, 2023 to October 16, 2023, and that period of time shall be excluded from the computation of time within which trial in this matter shall be commenced.

A new case management order will be entered once a trial date is scheduled.
